LEARN TO TAKE IMPLANT-LEVEL IMPRESSIONS AND RESTORE STRAIGHTFORWARD CASES IN YOUR OWN OFFICE

Dental implants are the treatment of first choice to replace missing teeth. And the simplest and most accurate way to restore them is to take implant-level impressions, letting the laboratory fabricate the abutment and crown or a one-piece screw retained crown.

And since implant-level impressions are much easier than traditional crown and bridge impressions, it is a skill that most general dentists should be able to master readily.

Yet many dentists have been hesitant to learn this skill, partly because of the myth that all implant cases are complicated and aren't part of general dentistry. This is nonsense; a large percentage of cases are straightforward and can and should be restored by the patient's regular dentist. This is especially true when cases involve both conventional and implant crowns, and they can be fabricated at the same time.

To address this need, we again present our short, one evening hands-on course on implant level impressions and restoration. Whether you are totally new to restoring implants or just want a refresher, this is a bare-bones, entry level course designed to get you started with simple cases. After you have done a number of simple cases, you should be able to expand your comfort level to include more and more sophisticated restoration.

For this course we have decided to demonstrate the Straumann Bone Level system, as it is one of the most commonly used systems in the Edmonton area, and an easy one to learn. However techniques demonstrated apply to all common root form implant systems.

Note that this course only applies to conventional analog impressions. Digital implant impressions and intraoral scanning are covered in a separate course.
